Director Service Delivery

BGEN Guy Feat is the Director Service Delivery for the NATO Communications and Information (NCI) Agency as of 1 January 2013. Previously, on 1 July 2012, he assumed the post as Interim Director of Operations for the NCI Agency.

On 1 June 2007, BGEN Feat joined the NATO C3 Agency (NC3A) as Director Sponsor Account NNEC Implementation Programmes (DSA NIP) responsible for the NATO common-funded NNEC (NATO Network Enabled Capability) implementation programmes assigned to NC3A. From 1 September 2010, he additionally took the responsibilities of Director Sponsor Account Allied Command Operations (DSA ACO) - the provision of the programmatic oversight for ACO and subordinate commands capability development as well as ACO-sponsored work funded by the Military Budget Committee (MBC) and NATO Security Investment Programme (NSIP).

Prior to joining NC3A (September 2004 - June 2007), he was Deputy to the Director of the French MOD Joint Information Technology Procurement Agency (under the Délégation Générale pour l'armement (DGA) Service des programmes d'observation, de telecommunication et d'information (SPOTI)), in charge of international acquisition, cooperation, interoperability and industrial affairs. He was responsible for major cooperative programmes such as NATO SATCOM Post-2000 and projects related to the federation of international observation satellites, and he led key bilateral C4ISR (command, control, communications, computers, intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance) cooperation programmes.

From December 1998 to September 2004, Mr Feat was Chief, Information Systems Branch, additionally serving as Deputy Director of the Acquisition Division (2000 - 2004) of NC3A. In this capacity he was responsible for guiding the acquisition and implementation of NATO's most challenging command and control communications and information systems to support the two NATO Strategic Commands.

From July 1996 to 1998, he was assigned to the French MOD's C4ISR Test and Evaluation Centre at CELAR (Centre d'électronique de l'armement) in Rennes (Brittany), which supports acquisition of C4ISR equipment. He was responsible for improving overall performance of the organization as a prerequisite to adopting a customer-funding regime, in a scientific organization used to operating on annual budget funding.

Between 1990 and 1996, his first assignment was to the NATO CIS Agency (NACISA) as a national expert in Automated Data Processing, in which capacity he was French representative at several working groups led by NACISA, the Major NATO Commands (MNC) and the International Staff. Mr Feat then became team leader for the NATO C3 Planning Coordination Office, under the direction of the C3 Director.

In 1985, Mr Feat was head of the electronics and data processing section of the French Defence Cooperation Attaché Office in Washington DC, USA. In this position he was responsible for several C4ISR cooperation programmes for the United States and French Armies.

Mr Feat began his career in 1977 as a scientist in a test and evaluation centre, supporting system acquisition conducted by senior programme managers. Subsequently he was nominated to be programme manager for several CIS systems.

Mr Feat was born on 2 March 1953 in St Jean du Doigt (Brittany, France). He graduated from the Ecole Supérieure de l'Armement Terrestre in 1976, and after serving one year in the Signal Corps of the 1er Régiment d'Artillerie de Marine, he entered the DGA of the French MOD as a professional engineer.
